## The Project:

1. **New Common Area:** Design a permanent meeting space for large gatherings, protecting the community from the intense Tanzanian sun and rain.
2. **Renovation of Existing Buildings:** Assess and develop a renovation project of the existing buildings struggling with poor ventilation and structural issues.
3. **Self-Sufficiency Project:** Contribute to the master plan that guides MS TCDC toward a greener, more sustainable future.

## About You:

- You have a degree in Architecture or related field.
- You have a particular interest in sustainable design and/or building renovation.
- You are passionate about volunteering and eager to work in a cross-cultural environment, with the possibility of participating in a field visit to Tanzania (preliminarily: 3-4 weeks, spring 25').
- You are ready to take on responsibility and ownership of the project, staying engaged throughout the process that will stretch over several months.
- You are comfortable working independently, balancing the roles of both design architect and project manager, ensuring that the project is effectively coordinated and executed.
- You are comfortable handling both communication and project material preparation in English.

*At Architects Without Borders, you should be able to commit a minimum of 5-10 hours per week and be flexible with evening meetings, as the project team often gathers in the afternoon/evening due to daytime work commitments. The work is voluntary and unpaid, but we offer various courses on development work, a friendly and supportive volunteer environment.*
